
Well, this is goodbye. After 29 years with the TIS it is time for me to depart. It has been such a rewarding time






The Maurie Plant Meet was held at the Lakeside Stadium, Melbourne on 23 February with several TIS athletes competing. Stewart finished second in the 3000m race in a time of 7:44.36. Jacob had a strong performance in the Men's 200m running fifth with a time of 20.91 and the third placed Australian. Jacob and Jack competed in the Men's 100m with Jacob placing fourth (second Australian) and Jack seventh (fifth Australian).


